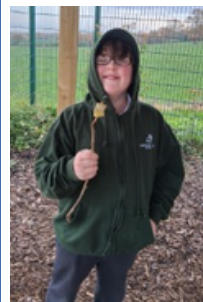
## Outdoor Education

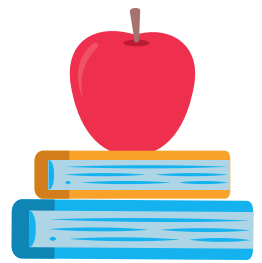
After all our hands-on learning and exploration, we love to finish each session gathered around the campfire with a well-deserved hot chocolate, warming up in the crisp winter air.

## Afon

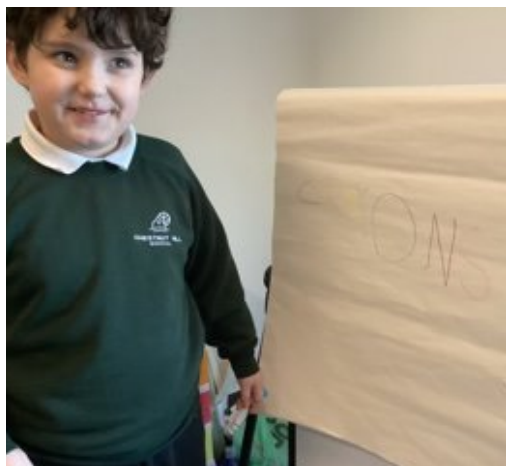
Afon have had an amazing second half to their Autumn term, and they should be very proud of themselves! It has become apparent that the children in Afon enjoy coming to school and always arrive with a smile on their face- which has been wonderful to see!

It has also been recognised that the children in Afon take part in a wide range of activities, and from this it has helped them to develop their overall confidence and skills- well done Afon! Supporting this, the children in Afon have received a multitude of rewards for following the school's ethos consisting of being: ready, safe and respectful. In addition, they always work hard and show motivation and enthusiasm whilst they are in school.

During our literacy lessons, we have been continuing to focus on the book 'We're Going to Find a Monster'. This term, we have looked closely at a wide range of phonic sounds that are linked to the vocabulary within the book. From this, children have been given the opportunity to make their own sentences through combining words that contain specific sounds. Furthermore, children have also practised using capital letters and full stops and have begun to check their work accordingly. In addition, children have been practising their inference skills and have considered a wide range of emotions and feelings that are presented in the book. This has also lent itself well to our PSHE lessons that consider strategies of regulation and ways we can make healthy choices.

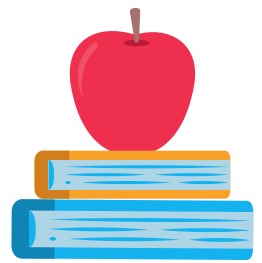
In maths, this term, we have looked closely at 2D and 3D shapes. Within this unit of work, we have learned about the names of shapes and their properties. One of the lessons, consisted of the children taking part in a shape hunt both in the classroom and around the outdoor facilities. They thoroughly enjoyed this aspect of the learning and began to see how shapes are used in real life as they had a practical hands-on experience. Afon children have also had the opportunity to develop their innovation, through creating pictures by using different shapes and lines.

During our recent expressive arts sessions, the children engaged in a paper mache project that focused on creating people's faces. The activity involved using: balloons, glue, paper and paint. The project helped to enhance their creativity when using paint to make their own unique facial details, through experimenting with a range of colours and patterns. It was clear the group thoroughly enjoyed the activity as they mentioned how fun it was! Supporting this, in our science lessons we have created a tough tray to show different landscapes linked to the book 'We're Going to Find the Monster'. One of the materials used was ice. From this, children have developed their exploration skills through play and scientific enquiry as this has been a vehicle to allow them to find out more about the world around them.

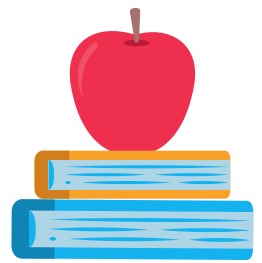

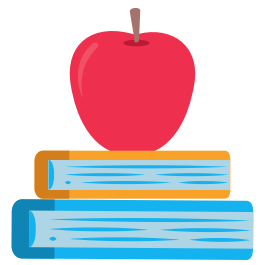
We are so overwhelmingly proud of all Dosbarth Menai pupils. We wish them and their families and friends a very Merry Christmas and a happy, healthy 2026.

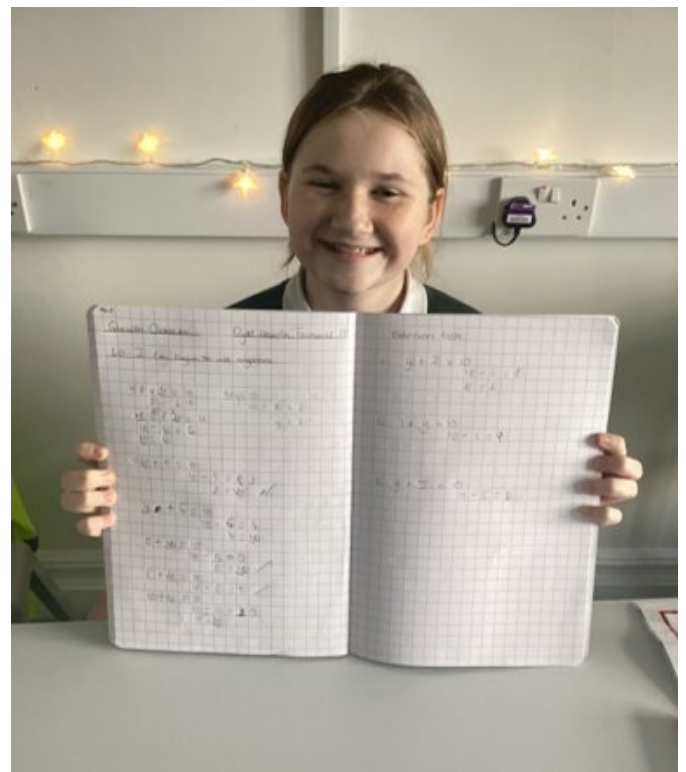

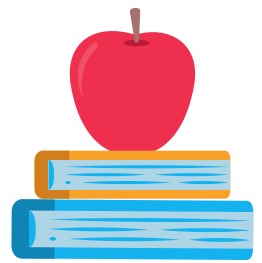

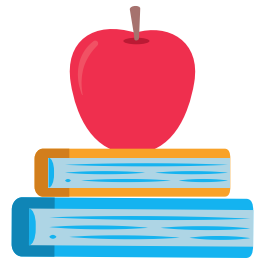

This half term Yr Wyddfa have been working hard on our schoolwork as well as developing our independence, team working skills, and our health and well-being. We enjoy taking part of the Golden Mile Walk and playing Cricket for Physical Education. Our pupils have been learning new skills, such as batting, fielding and bowling. The class has worked great in teams and has supported each other. The pupils in Yr Wyddfa have expended their social and emotional skills; welcoming other new pupil into the class and being very welcoming and supportive.

This term we have purposely been learning about appreciation and friendships, this is to support the pupils with their social and emotional understandings of the world and to understand and encourage positive relationships with friends, online friends and friends outside school.

In Language, Literacy and Communication we have been working from our scheme of work, 'Pathways to Write'. We have been learning about famous artists and their songs from different genres. Our pupils have been learning about the meanings of different songs, they have been breaking the songs down, rewritten the songs along with writing power speeches and written letters of sympathy, showing empathy, relating to their own life experiences.

Our pupils have been learning and developing their grammar, extending their vocabulary and staff have been successful encouraging the pupils to check their work against the success criteria.

The pupils in Yr Wyddfa have been amazing at working as a team to create multiple PowerPoint Presentations and factfiles and have presented them to the class to develop their confidence.

In Mathematics and Numeracy our pupils have been learning fractions, decimal points and percentages. Our pupils have been learning to find the fraction of a whole number using visual aids. Our pupils have been working independently by the end of the term!

Our pupils attend yoga lessons with Sally and every week and have been engaging well with the new routines and staff member. Our pupils have chosen other pupils they want to join; some pupils are from different classes.
